As we reflect on the past year, I am filled with gratitude for our Library's enthusiastic patrons, generous donors and dedicated staff. Together, we have made significant strides in enhancing our library services in the areas of highest priority for our community. This year, The Library Foundation invested in outreach programs designed to engage all segments of our community. Our Children's Librarian strengthened impressive connections with local students, visiting every Kindergarten and Fifth-grade class in Wellesley's elementary schools. These visits not only familiarized children with library resources, but also prepared them for the academic challenges ahead in middle school and beyond.

Our English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) made great advances in further facilitating connections for adult learners from diverse backgrounds. Under the guidance of a dedicated Coordinator, we welcomed participants from 15 countries, including refugees from Ukraine, highlighting our commitment to serve the global community. The program's structure allows students to progress through tailored classes, culminating in volunteer opportunities that encourage them to give back in turn to newcomers to the program.

The Library Foundation's funding for technology enhancements and educational programming has been crucial. Thanks to your generous support, technology programming flourished with more than 130 in-person and digital events, ranging from introductory courses on ChatGPT and cybersecurity to graphic design and job networking. The expansion of Jackie's Room is in the planning stages, aiming to provide even more resources and learning opportunities in areas including podcasting, digital conversion, video design, and more.

In April, we celebrated at The Library Foundation Gala where we raise critical funds to provide enhancements to our Library that our community relies on. Nearly 250 guests joined us at the Wellesley Country Club for an unforgettable evening and we raised over \$330,000, our largest amount ever.

Preparing Residents for Success

The support from our tutors, who provided over 1,340 hours of personalized instruction, remains invaluable. We are excited to introduce an American History class this fall, further enhancing our curriculum for those building their knowledge of their new home.





Nurturing a Love For Reading

This year, we continued to invest in outreach programs designed to engage all segments of our community. We saw remarkable success in our summer reading program, "Read, Renew, Repeat," with 378 children participating—nearly a hundred more than last year. This surge in engagement, supported by our Foundation's funding for registration software and grand prizes like LEGO kits, underscores our growing connection with our young patrons.


We've also created an increasingly welcoming environment for children of all neurotypes and abilities. This year, our partnerships with the Federation for Children with Special Needs and iCanFly introduced a sensory-friendly environment and dedicated playtime for children to explore and interact while developing gross and fine motor skills. These collaborations bring playtime to life in a critical new way for these parents and children, and foster inclusivity and exploration in our library space.

The inclusion extended beyond our walls with books from the 2024 summer reading list given to the Barton Road community, and for every infant born at Newton Wellesley Hospital in the form of "Born to Read" gift bags of board books, library card applications, and other literary resources.

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
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Gala
